In cases where transactions appear to be suspicious, and you are contacted by **Fraud Prevention Services**, you will be asked for the LAST 4 DIGITS of your social security number to verify your identity.

Here are some additional ways to protect your account from fraud:

- Contact the bank ASAP if you suspect your card has been used fraudulently. The Bank's number (1-877-722-6243) is also located on the back of your card.
- If your card is lost or stolen outside of normal banking hours, contact Fraud Prevention Services directly at **1-800-264-5578**.
- Notify us at the bank if you plan to travel, especially outside of the US. A note will be placed on your account to notify Fraud Protection Services in advance.
- Stay on top of your accounts. Keep track of your balance and account activity on a regular basis.
- Never keep your PIN with your card OR give your PIN to anyone!
